



Iron Butt Association - Guidelines for the Austria 4 Corners Ride

Many thanks to Rüdiger, who designed this beautiful ride.

The 4 Corners of Austria (**A4C**) takes you to the most **northerly**, **southerly**, **easterly** and **westerly** points of Austria, as well as to it's geographical centre and several other interesting locations.

Please note:

The A4C can only be ridden by IBA members and must be combined with an IBA ride of your own choice.

Since both the start and end receipts must be from Austria, an SS1600K or SS1000 would certainly be a good choice.

In addition to the general IBA Ride Guidelines, the following **specific rules** apply to the A4C:

In addition to the usual **filling station** receipts, the ride must be **documented** with photographs taken at the **following locations**:

- the **four corners** of Austria
- the **geographical centre** of Austria
- the **Dientner Sattel** mountain
- the **Gerlos Pass toll road** (night-time photo or toll receipt)
- the **University of Leoben**.

You also need to obtain **filling station receipts** from these **four cities in Austria** (no suburbs or different names on receipt):

- **Eisenstadt**
- **Innsbruck**
- **Linz**
- **Salzburg**

Please note !!

All points are reachable from Austria, it is not necessary to leave the Austrian state area to get to one of the points. If the sat nav leads over Slovakia, Czech Republic, Hungary or Slovenia, then a planning error exists.

The city name on the receipt may not be a suburb or a city with a different name.

The **start** and **end** filling station receipts **DO NOT** have to be from any of these four cities.

To sum up, **eight photographs** and (at least) four filling station receipts are required.

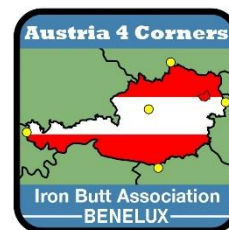
You may plan and complete your ride in any order, and you may start and finish your ride at any location in Austria. Both the start and end receipts must come from Austria.

ATTENTION! Both the start and the end receipt must be from Austria.

Furthermore, the following should be **noted**:

This ride is a very demanding ride due to its complexity and its high proportion of country roads.

Therefore - this ride is for **IBA MEMBERS ONLY**.



Like every IBA-Ride the A4C starts and ends with a filling station receipt.

If you are planning to ride with pillion - the pillion must be on all photos.

All locations must be photographed as described and be clearly visible.

All photos should be in jpeg format, the resolution should be not higher than 1920 x 1080.

Please make sure before the start of the Ride that the date and time of the camera are set correctly..

Plan carefully and keep the rules and you will have this ride always in good memory.

Special Ride A4C



Austria's easternmost point

N48° 00.391' E17° 09.646'

Take a photo of your **motorbike** at the pillar marking the point where three countries meet.

You can ride along the border trail between Austria and Hungary.



Austria's northernmost point

N49° 01.032' E15° 01.637'

Take a photo of the **wooden bridge** with the two country signs.

You must also be in the photo. The road ends approx. 200 m in front of the bridge. A track leads to the bridge



Austria's southernmost point

N46° 25.122' E14° 31.608'

Take a photo of your motorbike next to the "**Seebergsattel Seehöhe 1218m**" sign.

The sign is located on the site of the former border control post.

Austria's westernmost point

N47° 16.400' E9° 32.203'

Take a photo of your motorbike and the bridge. The sign "Rhein" must clearly be seen on the photo.



Austria's geographical centre

N47° 36.545' E13° 47.060'

Take a selfie at the **pillar** marking Austria's geographical centre.



University of Leoben

N47° 23.080' E15° 05.565'

Take a photo of the university. Your motorbike and the inscription „**Glück auf**“ over the main entrance must be clearly visible in the photo.

Special Ride A4C



Gerlos Pass

N47° 14.205' E12° 09.508'

A toll receipt from the **Gerlos Pass toll road** must be obtained and submitted. The toll booth is closed at night, but the road is open. In this case, take a **photo** of your motorbike at the Gerlos Pass building.



Dientner Sattel

N47° 23.498' E13° 03.457'

Take a photo of the “**Dientner Sattel Seehöhe 1370m**” sign with your motorbike.
