



Iron Butt Association - Guidelines for the Mille Miglia SS1000

The Italian Mille Miglia is a historic tour from Brescia in the north of Italy to Rome round trip. This tour is now available as a IBA Special SaddleSore 1000. You will ride the route



The Mille Miglia was an open-road, motorsport endurance race established in 1927 by the young Counts Francesco Mazzotti and Aymo Maggi, which took place in Italy twenty-four times from 1927 to 1957 (thirteen before World War II, eleven from 1947).

Start is the entrance of the Mille Miglia Museum in Brescia and the turn point in Rome is the Vatican. And you will return to Brescia for the last photo, a selfie with the race car on the roundabout.

You can ride this as a Special Ride without any time and distance requirements or combine it with a classic IBA ride of your choice as an IBA Ride Plus. This ride is a very demanding ride due to its complexity and its high proportion of two-lane national roads.

Please note:

In addition to the general IBA Ride Guidelines, the following **specific rules** apply to this Mille Miglia ride:

You need a photo, as mentioned, at the start and at the finish in Brescia (together with the receipts of the filling station where you register the ODO meter). Also you need a photo of you, your motorbike (and your pillion) at the Vatican in Rome (it should be clear the you are at the Vatican).

In addition to these photos at those marks, you will need filling stations receipts from the following cities (the city name should be printed on the receipt):

- Comacchio, Ferrara, Emilia Romagna
- Ancona, Le Marche
- Montecatini Terme, Pistoia, Toscana
- Milan (Milano), Lombardi

And the filling station receipt in Brescia (2 times).

The total Mille Miglia should be at least 1600 kilometres (mille miglia, 1000 miles) (calculated in Google Maps with the filling station receipts and photos as evidence) to be certified as a SaddleSore 1000 IBA Benelux Special Ride.

Sector 1 from Brescia (CO 1) to Ferrara (CO 2)

Sector 2 from Ferrara (CO 2) to Cervia (CO 3)

Leg 2

Sector 3 from Cervia (CO 4) to Urbino (CO 5)

Sector 4 from Urbino (CO 5) to Fabriano (CO 6)

Sector 5 from Fabriano (CO 6) to Terni (CO 7)

Sector 6 from Terni (CO 7) to ROME (CO 8)

Leg 3

Sector 7 from ROME (CO 9) to Radicofani (CO 10)

Sector 8 from Radicofani (CO 10) to Siena (CO 11)

Sector 9 from Siena (CO 11) to Montecatini Terme (CO 12)

Sector 10 from Montecatini Terme (CO 12) to Bologna (CO 13)

Leg 4

Sector 11 from Bologna (CO 14) to Parma (CO 15)

Sector 12 from Parma (CO 15) to Brescia (CO 16)
